Chief Superintendent Lynnette Anderson's December 2025 Message

The season of Advent is upon us, when our amazing ECSD community celebrates that "The Word became flesh and lived among us" (John 1:14). There are far too many events between now and Christmas for me to share them all in this brief December Message, so I will only highlight a few reflections according to my usual themes of truth, beauty, and goodness.

TRUTH. In response to the instructional time lost to the labour dispute, there has been much discussion about potential changes to the school calendar. The cancellation of the January Diploma Exams and the ensuing cancellation of exam week have allowed high schools to add seven instructional days to the end of the first semester. This modification in high schools will be the only change to the 2025-2026 school calendar. At the elementary and junior high levels, our Learning Services consultants and staff have implemented new cross-curricular plans and realigned the pacing guides for the remainder of the school year. These modifications will ensure learning outcomes are met without the need to change the school calendar for elementary and junior high schools.
